### WE WILL:

- \* Deliver a flexible curriculum that meets students needs

- \* Encourage parents to understand that every day of attendance counts
- \* Implement intervention programs for Students At Educational Risk (SAER)
- \* Provide extension programs for students who are working above the expected level
- \* Enrich Early Childhood Education
- \* Explicitly teach behaviour expectations through the PBS program
- \* Continue to update technology to enhance learning

### Our Targets:

- For each year of the plan Yrs 3,5,7 and 9 NAPLAN Reading, Writing and Numeracy achievement will be equal to or above like schools.
- By 2024 all NQS standards will be met.
- For each year of the plan our unexplained absences % will be equal to or lower than like schools numbers.
- Overall attendance rate will be 90% for Primary and 85% for Secondary.
- Each student at educational risk (SAER) has a clear and achievable documented plan.



## WE WILL:

- \* Analyse data to make evidence-based decisions regarding students' needs and resourcing
- \* Implement an explicit teaching pedagogy across the school
- \* Apply research based best practice across the whole school
- \* Engage in professional learning opportunities related to whole school focus areas
- \* Incorporate innovative teaching and assessment practices
- \* Engage in the Performance Growth Cycle
- \* Facilitate mentoring opportunities for staff members
- \* Contribute to networks enabling the sharing of best practice across schools

## Our Targets:

- High Impact Teaching Strategies (HIITS) used in all classrooms and embedded by 2023.
- National School Opinion Survey (NSOS) data indicates that parents and students agree that the quality of teaching in the school is satisfactory.
- All teachers will engage in a rigorous Performance Growth Cycle.
- The KDHS Learning Framework will be embedded in all classrooms.
