I cannot believe we are at the end of Term 1 already. As a school we have achieved a great deal; including the revision of our Parent Handbook and formalising of some key policies. We responded to the Minister's plan to address violence in schools by reinstating a Good Standing policy. I am pleased to say, that at the end of Term 1, all students are in 'good standing'.

I would also like to take this opportunity to thank you for supporting our efforts to have all students wearing the correct school uniform. As we move into the cooler months our focus will be on appropriate jumpers and jackets. Please make sure that your child wears a navy school jumper or jacket or an undershirt in navy or white only. 2019 is the final year the hooded leaver's jumper is able to be worn. No other hooded jumpers or jackets are acceptable. If for some reason your child needs to be out of school uniform, please contact the school with an explanation as this will impact on your child's good standing status.

In Week 4, a combined Year 5/6/7 boys' team will play with students from Carnarvon, Meekatharra and Mt Magnet at Optus stadium and in Week 5 our Year 7/8 and 9/10 girls will participate in the Great Southern Youth Girls AFL league inaugural game (more details will be available next term).

P.A.R.T.Y YEAR 10 EXCURSION







On the 3rd April, the Year 10 girls participated in the P.A.R.T.Y Program at the Katanning hospital. P.A.R.T.Y stands for Preventing Alcohol and Risk-Related Trauma in Youth.

To start the day, the Year 10 girls were kindly driven by Tracy Cox to the Katanning Hospital. Mr Trouchet later joined us. When we arrived, we were greeted by a nurse called Ben, who was also the P.A.R.T.Y Co-ordinator. We were taken into the hospital meeting room where we were given lanyards and had to complete a quiz. Ben then showed a slideshow of graphic videos and images of people who had been involved in alcohol and risk related accidents. It was an eye opener to see what could happen and gave us some great awareness and caution about future choices. After that, two ambulance volunteers presented a small slideshow about what effects and traumas they see and attend to. We learnt how much it could also affect the first responder and how the ripple effect played a major part in most traumas. A lady from Palmerston Counselling then came in and talked about what she does and what Palmerston Counselling does for youth. We then had a chance to try beer goggles. We were given different strengths and were able to try night vision beer goggles. We had to catch a ball and then throw it back.

We had morning tea and then had a demonstration of what it's like to be an ambulance patient. We were told about certain bags that a volunteer would take into certain situations and what is considered a major and minor trauma. We then went into the ER and were shown what would happen to a patient after leaving an ambulance. We were dressed in PPE and experienced what a nurse or doctor would have to do and wear.

After lunch we went to the physiotherapy room and were given a few challenges by the physiotherapists. We were challenged with crutches, wheelchairs, and getting a lolly out of a bag with a hand brace on. After that we went back to the meeting room where the speech pathologist showed them what devices a person with speech disorders would use to communicate. We tried food that a person with swallowing difficulties would have to eat. We were given pureed potato, stew, broccoli, carrots, and three types of thickened water. We then filled out another quiz. Tracy was extremely nice and took the girls to the Dome for a drink.

Thank you to Tracy who drove us and bought us drinks, Mr Trouchet for organising it and all the hospital staff for having us there.
