Until our next edition may it rain or not depending on your agricultural wants and needs.

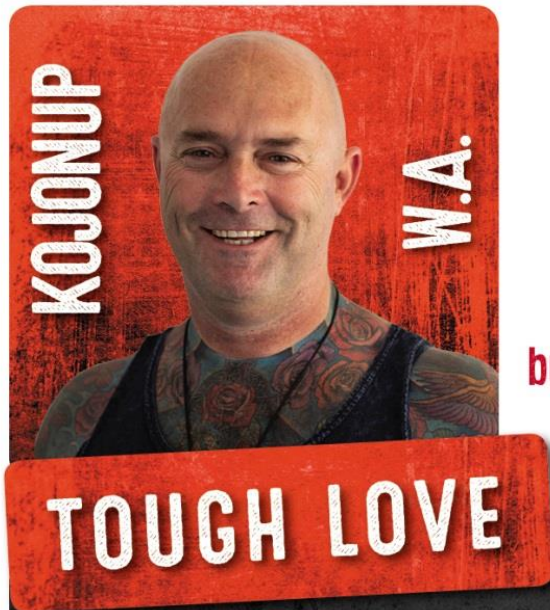

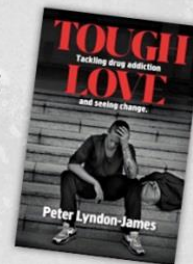
