**Dress Code** 

## Rationale

Dress codes for students in public schools are determined by school councils in consultation with students, their parents, and staff of the school. Dress codes can help create a sense of identity and a school culture in which every student experiences a sense of belonging.

The KDHS Dress Code complies with the DoE Policy: Dress Codes for Students in Public Schools, Jan 2018 and is compulsory for PP-Year 10 students.

## Uniform Guide

This is a guide to what KDHS expects all students to wear while at school during normal school hours.

Shirt	<ul> <li>Navy/light blue with KDHS logo (K-6) Navy/white with KDHS logo (7-10)</li> <li>Navy shirt without KDHS logo</li> <li>Undershirts in navy or white</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Non-school uniform top (school uniform must be visible)</li> <li>Undershirts in other colours</li> <li>Cougars football shirt</li> </ul>
Bottoms	<ul> <li>Plain navy blue</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Patterns, rips, studs, sheer panels, logos</li> <li>Shorts/skirts that are too revealing</li> <li>Denim of any description</li> </ul>
Outerwear	<ul> <li>Plain navy blue with or without KDHS logo</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Hooded jumpers/jackets</li> <li>Non navy jumpers or jackets</li> <li>Items with large logos or patterns</li> </ul>
Shoes	<ul> <li>Closed in shoes or sturdy sandals</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Shoes that are unsafe or unsuitable for practical classes- thongs, open shoes</li> <li>Crocs</li> <li>Ugg Boots</li> </ul>
Hat	Preferably wide brim or cap     Hats are compulsory Term 1&4	Offensive or inappropriate slogans or artwork
Sports	<ul> <li>Faction shirt with or without logo (red, green, or yellow)</li> <li>Regular school shirt</li> </ul>	Singlets and non-school uniform shirts
Accessories	• Large accessories such as scarves, socks should be in line with school colours	<ul> <li>Accessories or piercings that pose a WHS risk</li> </ul>
Farm	<ul> <li>Suitable work wear (shirts must have sleeves) closed in shoes or boots.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Any item that may pose a WHS risk, singlets, shorts that are too revealing</li> </ul>

Exemptions to the Dress Code can be obtained through the school due to unavailability of an item, medical grounds, or another reason that in the Principal's opinion is sufficient to warrant an exemption. Exemption requests should be made in writing to the Principal. Persistent non-compliance or refusal to adhere to the Dress Code may result in loss of Good Standing.
