Over the past few weeks, I have had the pleasure of getting to know students, staff, and families, and I have been particularly impressed by the genuine care and support students show one another. It is especially heartwarming to see our older students step in to help and guide the younger ones—it truly speaks to the respectful and inclusive culture that exists here.

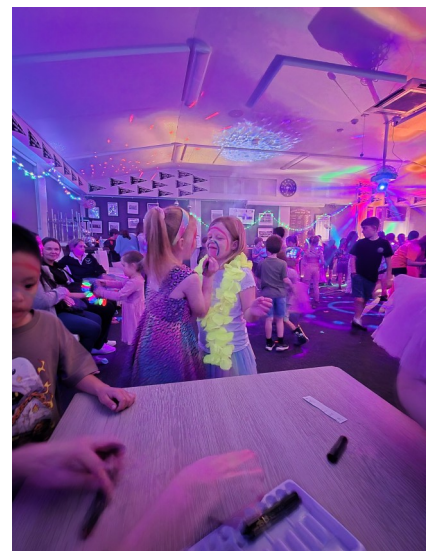
P&C DISCO

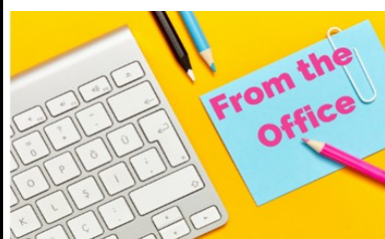


YEAR 9 CAREER TASTER HOSPITALITY INCURSION

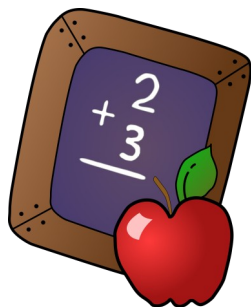

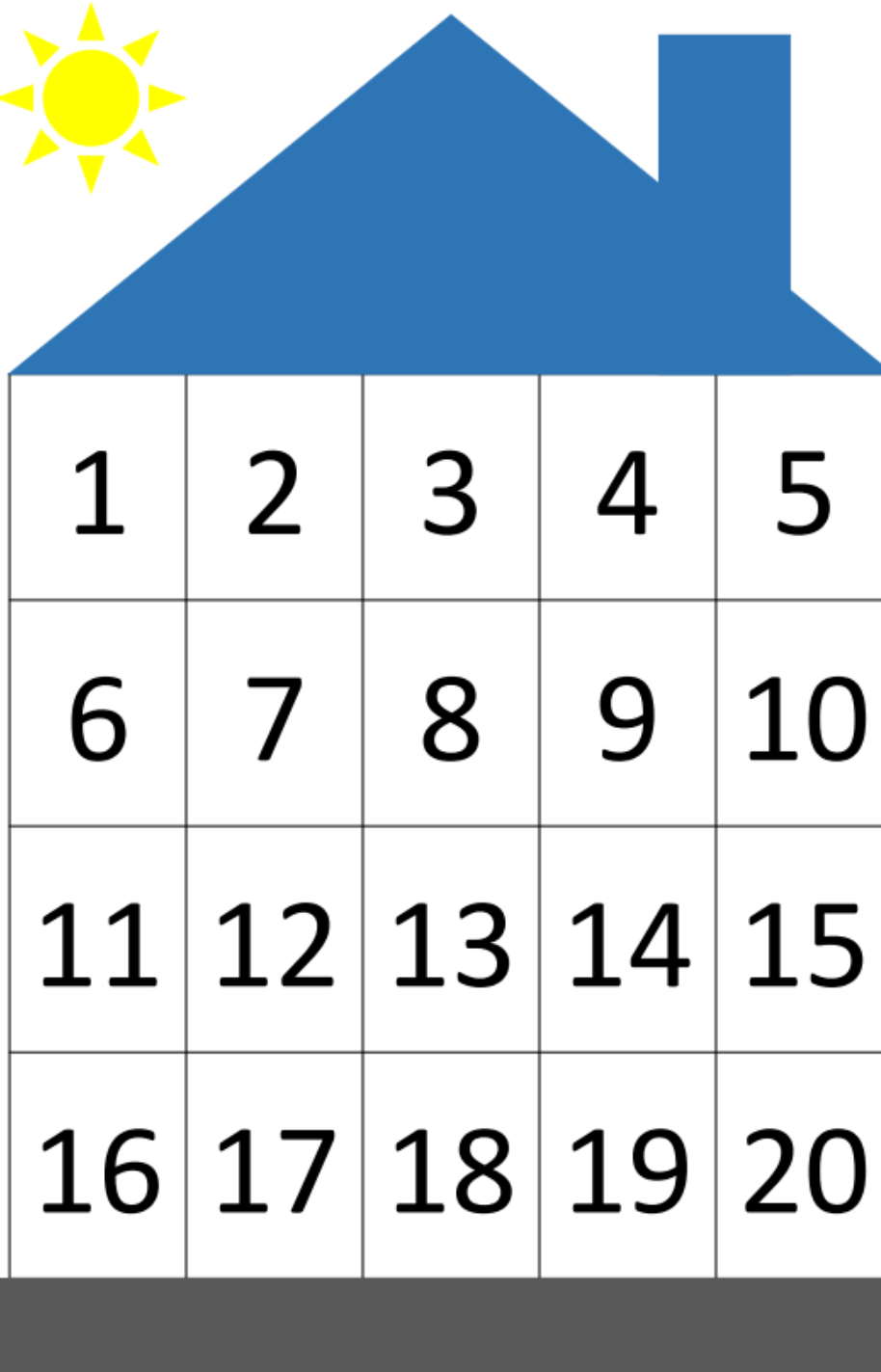
You will need a deck of cards or 2 dice, 7 objects or counters, and the numbers 1-20 written down.

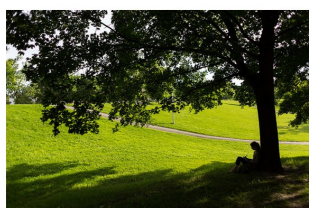

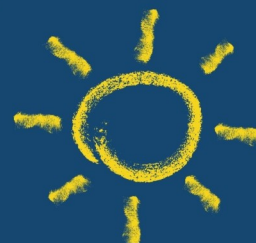

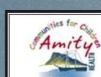
