

KDHS farewells and celebrates the incredible commitment and extraordinary services of Mrs Julie Fleay and Mr Warren Porter.

Warren and Julie have decided to pull up stumps and begin to enjoy the fruits of their hard work and dedication spanning approximately 75 years' service to Kojonup DHS.



Warren has dedicated 40 years' service to KDHS commencing in October 1985. His official role was Head Gardener and Maintenance Officer and he undertook all of his duties with pride and enthusiasm. The gardens and lawns were always neat and the rose garden in the front was a mass of blooms. Earning prizes at the Show was not uncommon in the earlier years. There are many behind the scene moments that Warren could be relied on to carry out. The BBQs were always cleaned and ready for the next fundraiser/Father's Day Breakfast etc. The marking of the ovals and preparation of jump pits for Sports Carnivals was done by Warren.

Warren took on the role of OHS officer and more recently was the Manual Arts Teacher for two years as a Limited Registration Teacher, a role that he relished in and spent much time preparing for his students' lessons. He maintained the playing ovals for the students and was a great fix it man if anything needed attention. Nothing was too much trouble for Warren. His commitment and dedication to the school community was absolute, even getting up at any odd hour if the School Security Alarm system was triggered.

Julie commenced her journey at the Community Kindergarten on the 23rd July 1991 (now Kojonup Child Care Centre). She was also a Handywoman/Maintenance guru. Access if any to Google back in the early 1990s was limited, if any, so all tasks were undertaken with gusto and the odd bit of blue tack!

As time evolved Julie went onto study at TAFE and qualify as an Educational Assistant, with Special Needs as her forte. Julie worked with warmth, patience, understanding and professionalism earning the respect of both the students, parents and her peers.

In her later years at KDHS, Julie has supported children, or sometimes grandchildren, of those she has helped in her earlier years—a legacy few can claim and speaks volumes of the impact she has had on the school community.


YEAR 6 CAMP
