## **FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK**

Welcome back to another school year, everyone.

Our start has been smooth and students are actively engaged in their learning in all classrooms. We have had a significant increase in high school numbers and have the lovely newly furnished and painted classrooms bulging! Our Year 7 students have transitioned to high school seamlessly, with many of them enjoying the variety that secondary school offers.

To assist with costs this year, all Admin staff, including myself, are teaching. This is assisting us to cover the classes we want to be offering to students. Our EAs are being used in as many classes as possible and due to funding, we cannot employ any extra. Every class has a need for EA support and we are doing our best to cover the classes we have with the EAs we have.

The Certificate II course for the Year 10 students has begun, as has the Work Experience program and it's great to see the maturity being shown by these students. The new Science laboratory conversion is complete, and this is another lovely new space for the students to work in. Tenders have gone out for the primary Science conversion with the expectation that work will start on Room 11 later in the term.

Trials for the swimming carnival are underway and students are enjoying being in the water on these warm days. Physical Education is a curriculum area, just like Maths and English, so students are expected to participate in all lessons. If there are medical grounds for your child to be excluded from a lesson, please notify the teacher and provide the documentation. Our Faction Swimming Carnival is on Friday of Week 4 (24<sup>th</sup> February) and the Interschool Carnival is hosted by us this year and is Wednesday of Week 6 (8<sup>th</sup> March). We hope to see you there.

The Meet 'n' Greet on Thursday evening was well attended and it was lovely to see members of our school community and have a quick catch up over a sausage sizzle!

Workload for teachers is a topical issue at the moment across the system and we are doing our bit to manage the workload of our staff. In order to do this, I have asked staff to limit the number of hours they are on call to parents and guardians. In answering messages from parents/guardians out of school hours, the staff have agreed

## Year 7 School Vaccination Program.

The 2023 WA School Based Immunisation Program will be offered at your school by the local community school health immunisation nurses.

These vaccinations are offered free to all year 7 students.

- One dose course of Human Papillomavirus (HPV) vaccine to be given during term 1
- One dose of diphtheria-tetanus-pertussis vaccine (whooping cough) given in term 1
- All students require parent/guardian consent before they can receive any vaccination at school. Please complete even if declining vaccines
- Parents/guardians are requested to provide consent through the online portal VaccinateWA. Login - VaccinateWA (health.wa.gov.au)
- For information and consent for vaccinations via VaccinateWA follow this link <u>School-based immunisation program (healthywa.wa.gov.au)</u> An informational video will guide you through registering a student.
- If you are not able to access the online system, you can request a hard copy form from school or copy below link into your internet browser for a printable consent that can be returned to school.

#### Department of Education

#### GENERAL INFORMATION

The State Government through the Western Australian Department of Education provides an allowance to assist eligible families with secondary schooling costs.

Parents/guardians must apply for the Secondary Assistance Scheme (SAS) each school year (annually) applications do not carry forward to future years.

To be eligible for the allowance the parent/guardian must hold a Services Australia (Centrelink) or Veterans' Affairs card that represents a statement of income for the family.

The allowance consists of two components:

- \$115 Clothing Allowance paid directly to the parent/guardian or the school.
- \$235 Educational Program Allowance paid directly to the school.

Application is made by the parent or guardian for student/s enrolled in Years 7-12 studying a full time secondary course at a Western Australian public school.

#### ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

Parent or Guardian must hold one of the following cards:

- Centrelink Health Care Card
- Centrelink Pensioner Concession Card
- Veterans' Affairs Pensioner Concession Card

Please Note: The only Veterans' Affairs Card that meets the criteria is a blue card that is issued annually and expires in December each year. This card is income means tested.

The parent/guardian must be the holder of a card that is valid some time during first term. Students must be listed on claimant's card (except for some year 11 and 12 students, or in cases of disability/health reasons). In this instance, the school must sight both concession cards. The only exception to this is when a student holds their own health care card and has been declared independent by Centrelink (e.g. Living Away from Home). In this instance, a letter of confirmation from Centrelink needs to accompany the application. The concession card must not be expired when applying for SAS.

The allowance is paid up to and including the year the student turns 18 years of age i.e. students born in 2004 or before are ineligible in 2023.

#### APPLICATION FORMS

Application forms should not be altered and are to be completed at the school during Term 1 only. If the form is completed prior to the commencement of Term 1 the school must complete the enrolment confirmation section to confirm attendance. (Forms dated by the school prior to

Term 1, 2023 will not be accepted). Please ensure you keep a photocopy of the signed form for school records.

#### LATE APPLICATIONS

SECONDARY ASSISTANCE SCHEME PUBLIC SCHOOLS

Applications close 6 April 2023

Late applications will only be accepted in extenuating circumstances and must be accompanied with a written explanation.

Eligible interstate or overseas students who are enrolled after first term may apply for the allowance. Date of enrolment must be noted on the application.

#### CONTRIBUTIONS AND CHARGES

Schools will receive the Educational Program Allowance of \$235 for Secondary Assistance recipients. For students in Years 7 to 10 the Allowance will be paid directly to the school and in the first instance, will be applied towards the voluntary contribution. Any balance will be applied against charges or as negotiated with the parent/guardian. For students in Years 11 to 12 the Allowance will be applied to cover charges, in the first instance.

#### CLOTHING ALLOWANCE

The clothing allowance of \$115 will be paid to the parent/guardian unless indicated on the application form that you wish it to be paid to the school. If payment to the parent/guardian is requested, the payment will be deposited into the parent/guardian bank account. It can take between 8 to 12 weeks to receive this payment.

#### PROCESSING OF PAYMENTS

Once the form is completed by the parent/guardian, the school will forward either the electronic file (via email) to the Financial Planning and Resourcing Directorate for processing whilst retaining the original application form at the school or if completing applications manually, forward the original application forms retaining a photocopy for the school records.

If you change any of your details supplied on the application form, please notify us as soon as possible on 9264 4516.

We will endeavour to have all clothing payments made to the parent/guardian by 31 May 2023.

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#### 2023 ABSTUDY SUPPLEMENT ALLOWANCE PUBLIC SCHOOLS Applications close 6 April 2023

#### GENERAL INFORMATION

The State Government through the Western Australian Department of Education provides an allowance to assist eligible families with secondary schooling costs. The ABSTUDY Supplement Allowance is available to valid Services Australia (Centrelink) card holders, this funding supplements the Centrelink ABSTUDY Fees Allowance payment.

Parents/guardians must apply for the Secondary Assistance Scheme (SAS) each school year (annually) – applications do not carry forward to future years.

To be eligible for the supplement allowance, the parent/guardian must hold a Centrelink or Veterans' Affairs card that represents a statement of income for the family.

Furthermore, the school or parent must have received the School Fee Allowance of \$78 or \$156 from the Centrelink as part of the student's ABSTUDY School Fees Allowance.

The Department of Education ABSTUDY Supplement Allowance consists of \$79 Education Program Allowance paid directly to the school.

Please note that the Secondary Assistance Scheme cannot be claimed as well as this allowance.

Application is made by the parent or guardian for student(s) enrolled in Years 7–12, studying a full time secondary course at a Western Australian public school.

#### ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

Parent or Guardian must hold one of the following cards:

- Centrelink Health Care Card
- Centrelink Pensioner Concession Card
- Veterans' Affairs Pensioner Concession Card

The only Veterans' Affairs Card that meets the criteria is a blue card that is issued annually and expires in December each year. This card is income means tested.
