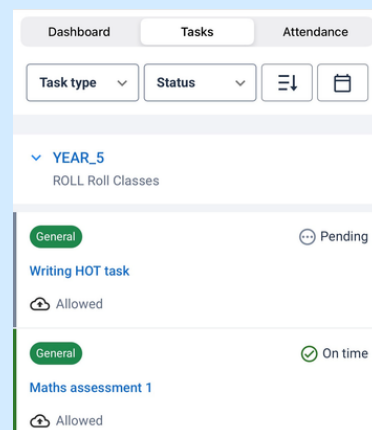
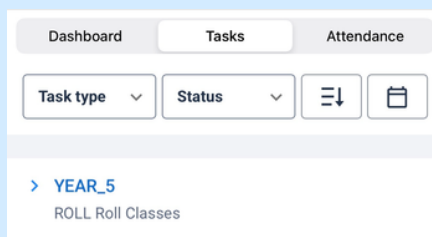

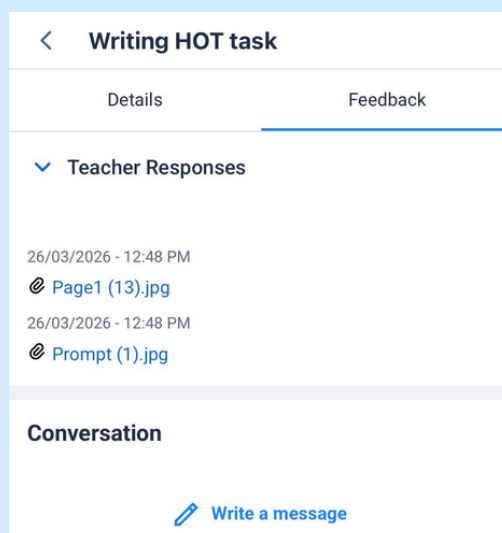
## LEARNING TASKS

# Digital Technologies

*Digital Technologies Teacher*

This term in Digital Technologies, students across the school have been developing their understanding of digital safety, privacy and how technology works in engaging and meaningful ways. Across the primary and secondary school areas, students have all been learning to sign in using a new security program called Authenticator. Authenticator is a new security step used when signing into the internet on the iPads, allowing the school to monitor student website usage and support safe online practices. As with all changes, this has involved learning new skills and routines. Alongside this shared learning, individual classes have been exploring a range of topics and activities suited to their year levels.

In **Pre-Primary**, students learnt to identify personal information that belongs to them and how to keep it safe, while also enjoying the use of iPads, OSMO and Dash robots.

In **Years 3 and 4**, students continued to build practical digital skills by learning to sign in to programs such as Word, improving their typing through TypingLand, and using Canva in Year 4 to create engaging and creative information sheets.

In **Years 5 and 6**, students explored digital systems, including input, processing and output devices, and began learning how computers use binary code to represent text, images, sounds and symbols. Students particularly enjoyed creating images through Pixel Art as part of this learning.

**Year 7** students focused on digital footprints, online reputation, password security, multifactor authentication and recognising phishing and scams.

**Year 8** students explored data ownership, ethical data collection, cybersecurity, data transmission methods and network security, and began designing simple real-life solutions using Micro:bit devices.

**Years 9 and 10** students examined digital systems, data ownership, the Australian Privacy Principles, privacy case studies, user consent and introductory webpage design, before beginning a mini project to design a "Privacy Help Site."

Across all year levels, students have been building valuable knowledge and skills to use technology safely, responsibly and creatively, while growing in confidence as thoughtful and capable digital learners.

A quick reminder that Education Department policy is that parents must complete an Administration of Medication form if your child is taking medication at school - whether short-term or long-term.

Please do not just put medication in your child's bag. There is a risk of it falling out and ending up in the hands of another child.

Front office staff are happy to keep the medication in the office and administer, if necessary.

We do not keep Panadol at the school and can only administer if the parent provides the medication and signs an Administration of Medication form. However, you are welcome to come to the school and give your child medication yourself, if required.

### **Medication and equipment**

If your child needs to be given medication during school hours, you need to provide:

- medication that is labelled with your child's name, in its original packaging and is within expiry
- written authorisation for the school to administer the medication using a standard form from the school.

This applies to medication for long-term and short-term use.

If your child needs medical equipment at school, it is important to ensure you supply the equipment in good working order.

It is important that you maintain communication with your child's school and advise of any changes or concerns you may have.

The Kids Access All Areas Vouchers program is an exciting new initiative for Western Australian children aged 5 to 15 to attend arts and cultural events.

Up to 25,000 vouchers will be available each year over 2 years.

Parents and guardians of children aged 5 to 15 can reserve one \$50 voucher per child, up to a maximum of 4 children for \$200.

Where can the vouchers be used?

Once a voucher/s are reserved, you can buy tickets from an approved venue or provider and then claim your rebate.

Vouchers can be used at over 100 venues or providers across Western Australia, providing convenient options to enjoy arts and cultural events across the state.

About the vouchers

Vouchers for the first round are limited and can be reserved until 30 April 2026, unless otherwise exhausted. You will then have until 31 May 2026 to buy tickets and claim your rebate.

The next round of Kids Access All Areas Vouchers is planned to open in August 2026.

Kids Access All Areas vouchers are limited to 1 per eligible child for the entire program. If you reserve a voucher in the first release, you won't be eligible for the second release.

Any unused balance on first round vouchers expires after 31 May 2026.

Rebates must be claimed by 31 May 2026.

How to reserve a voucher and redeem a rebate

Participating in the Kids Access All Areas Vouchers program is a 3 step process:

1. Reserve your voucher/s via the ServiceWA app
2. Buy your tickets for an arts or cultural event from an approved venue or provider
3. Claim your rebate by uploading your tax invoice/s in the ServiceWA app.

The ServiceWA app is the fastest, most secure and most convenient way to claim and redeem Kids Access All Areas Vouchers.
