### SPONSORSHIP AGREEMENT

The sponsorship agreement between Kojonup District High School and Flat Rocks One Wind Farm Pty Ltd has been finalised. The agreement began on 01.06.2023 and will run for 5 years, expiring on 01.06.2027. This agreement has been endorsed by the School Council.

Flat Rocks One Wind Farm Pty Ltd have contributed \$60,000 including GST, to our school. These funds will add to the school's current reserve funds, allowing us to purchase a new 25-seater school bus. The school logo and the logo of the windfarm will be displayed on the bus. The school has started the procurement process with the Department of Education and we are hoping to have a bus towards the end of 2024.

#### **Child Dental Benefits Schedule**

The Child Dental Benefits Schedule is the Commonwealth funded Child Dental Program which commenced on 1 January 2014 which will allow benefits to be paid by Medicare for basic dental services provided to children and teenagers aged 2 to 17 years. To be eligible to receive dental care via the Child Dental Benefits Schedule a child/teenager's family must be a recipient of Family Tax Benefit Part A

From 1 January 2017, the Child Dental Benefits Schedule will enable an eligible child/ teenager to receive \$1000 of dental care over a two year period. The Child Dental Benefits Schedule replaces the Medicare Teen Dental Plan.

The Commonwealth Government through the Department of Human Services will write to children and teenagers confirming eligibility each year.

Please note that all dental care provided by the School Dental Therapy Centre continues to be at no cost to patients.

Some School Dental Therapy Centre's are able to provide dental services via the Child Dental Benefits Schedule to enrolled school children aged 5 to 16 years.
